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bochinche

BOCHINCHE word comes from the Mapudungun and means people making noise as stormy sea is used much in the South of Argentina and Chile while you can listen to in other places in the Americas

cambalache

Cambalache; It is the place that mainly Mapuche indigenous peoples approached to perform swaps in times of peace with the inhabitants of the villages of the Viceroyalty of the rio de la plata for the upper classes of the colony was a despicable place. Forms of the words change (of the 41 Spanish; and che (Mapuche) its meaning would be the place where people change things its synonyms would be fair, market, Exchange, etc. It was originally used in the southern part of the Viceroyalty of the rio de la plata and especially in Buenos Aires and tango by Enrique Santos Discépolo 20th century cambalache today are used in the Hispanic world as a synonym for a place where everything is bought and sold all
